## The lives of Patty and her children are changed for good, thanks to you.

Facing homelessness, "Patty" came to Unity House for help. She had a history of struggle, notably around housing stability. She and her children faced relocation multiple times, disrupting the children's education each time. Patty was easily overwhelmed by maintenance issues and did not always communicate with her landlord, which created a cascade of consequences. Some maintenance issues, despite her best efforts, remained unresolved. Post-pandemic housing shortages and rising rents only added to Patty's challenges. Patty and her family were stuck in a bad cycle.

Unity House's Community Housing Assistance Program, or CHAP for short, was able to help Patty. Working with a dedicated case manager and a HUD Housing Specialist, Patty was able to find a new apartment that felt safe and secure for her and the children. They moved in, and Patty started in our PROS Program.

PROS stands for Personalized Recovery Oriented Services. It's a mental health program based out of Unity House's Menands location. For Patty, the classes, the structure, and the self-direction of the program, were each empowering in their own way.

Patty has demonstrated unwavering dedication and great progress. For apartment-related issues, she can communicate effectively with her landlord. Using email allows her to include her case manager and housing program director, to keep everyone in the loop. For Patty, it helps to know she has a team rooting for her. There are people available if she needs support on follow through, whether it's over a leaky faucet or getting herself to her

program. Patty's successes built up her confidence. The mix of stable housing, mental health services, and practical supports has been the recipe for success for Patty. Her children have greater stability and Patty is better able to manage her day-to-day responsibilities.

Patty's resilience and commitment are to be commended and her successes celebrated. Her journey has been amazing to witness. To some, Patty's goals may seem simple. She wants to continue to improve her mental stability and maintain safe housing for herself and her children. It's what we all want to see.

# Making Holiday Magic

Last December, the request came in late: Can we help a displaced family with holiday gifts? Moira Geracitano, coordinator for the Children's Holiday Program, sprang into action. She got a list of the children's ages, genders, and sizes for clothing and shoes.

Thanks to supporters of the Children's Holiday Program, Moira was able to put together boxes filled with new, age-appropriate toys as well as a variety of necessities such as pajamas, underwear, and winter coats. There was even a bag of personal care products for Mom, a woman seeking refuge at Unity House's residence for victims of domestic violence.

Unity House often responds to crisis, addressing an emergency and then charting a path to sustained stability. The work is demanding and offers little time to consider luxuries, such as gifts at holiday time.

"For parents, the stress of trying to meet your child's needs, much less wants, is incredible," says Moira. As coordinator, "I'm grateful that I can play a part in helping families in this way. It's a tremendous undertaking made possible only with lots of help." I have a 'tween daughter and I had nothing to give her, even though I was working two jobs. After coming to the food pantry, I signed up for the Children's Holiday Program. I picked out snow boots, a hairdryer, new books, and a nice art set. It totally made me cry. When my daughter asked why I was crying, I told her I was just so happy, and she said, 'Me too, Mom.' This was the best Christmas ever.

#### Self-Empowerment

Maria utilized services she was eligible for while working full time and being a single parent. Maria went back to finish school. When her children's school let out for the summer, she signed them up for Unity House's Travelling Summer Camp. The kids loved it and Maria loved having a safe space for her kids.

Maria was steadfast in the pursuit of her goals, which included a move closer to family and a higher-paying job. Just like a single instance can lead to a series of downturns, so too can a small success become a building block for the next step to greater self-sufficiency.

For Maria, the foundation was a welcoming intake worker who helped Maria identify her strengths and needs, draw upon her abilities, and see her potential, starting as a Unity House staffer.
